<p>Elizabeth Collar (This is prescribed after the surgery to prevent infection or opening the stitches by licking at the incision site. Other alternatives are not advised. (E-collars have to be brought in at the point of admission to prevent them from licking the area straight after the surgery))</p>	<p>\$13-18</p>
<p>Pre-Anaesthetic Blood Work (Strongly recommended to detect any pre-existing conditions that may increase anaesthetic risk, especially in pets over 7 years of age, those that have never undergone general anaesthesia, or those without bloodwork performed within the past 6 months.)</p>	<p>\$185-245 or more</p>
<p>Radiographs (Radiographs before anesthesia ensure your pet's safety by assessing heart and lung health, detecting hidden conditions, guiding anesthetic plans, and identifying potential risks, especially in older or sick animals. This helps minimize complications and tailor care for the best outcomes. Especially in pets over the age of 7 and pets who have never undergone general anaesthesia before.)</p>	<p>\$180</p>
<p>Microscopic check of fur (A microscopic check of your cat's fur is a mandatory part of our pre-surgical screening. This examination helps us identify any potential skin parasites such as mites or fungi. Parasite infestation can increase the risk of surgical site infections. Treating the infestation before surgery helps ensure a smoother and safer recovery for your cat. This examination is crucial for the health and safety of your cat and other animals in the clinic. )</p>	<p>\$15</p>
<p>IDEXX Snap 4Dx test (For dogs) (Strongly recommended for pets who have not been on tick and flea prevention as well as heartworm protection.)</p>	<p>\$65</p>
<p>Coagulation Panel (PT/APTT) (PT-This blood test checks how quickly your pet's blood can clot. It's important before surgery or if we suspect poisoning or bleeding problems, because if the blood doesn't clot properly, even small injuries or operations can become dangerous. APPT-It helps us see if the blood takes too long to clot, which can happen with certain illnesses, medications, or clotting disorders. This is important to know before surgery or if your pet is bleeding. These tests check how well your pet's blood can clot from two different pathways, helping us detect bleeding risks or clotting problems, especially before surgery.)</p>	<p>\$145</p>
