<p><b>Rabies Vaccination</b></p> <p><b>Protection against rabies virus (usually for exportation purposes)</b> (Rabies is a deadly virus that is spread through the saliva of an infected host. It is a zoonotic disease that can be spread to humans, the most common host being dogs. In Singapore, we are rabies free, and rabies vaccinations are usually performed for exportation purposes. <p><b>Bordetella (Kennel Cough)</b></p> <p><b>Protection for dogs in close contact with other dogs</b> (Bordetella, also known as Kennel Cough, is a highly contagious virus that can be easily spread between dogs via aerosols. It is usually seen in puppies housed closely with one another in kennels, where they are housed closely with one another, thus the spread is easier. Symptoms include sneezing, runny nose, coughing, lethargy and inappetence. <p><b>Proheart Injection</b></p> <p><b>Annual heartworm prevention for dogs</b>          (The ProHeart injection is an annual injection for dogs given concurrently with their vaccination to protect them from heartworm. Heartworm is a parasitic worm that lives in the heart and is spread through mosquitoes. If left untreated, it could cause a blockage in the veins, which could be fatal. <p><b>Rabbit</b></p> <p><b>Protection against Rabbit Haemorrhagic Disease Virus</b>          (This vaccination for rabbits targets specifically the Rabbit Haemorrhagic Disease Virus, a Calicivirus that is highly contagious and fatal to rabbits and is exotic to Singapore. However, in October 2020, the first case of rabbits with this contagious virus was reported in Singapore. **Important: For puppies and kittens starting their vaccination program from 2 months old, multiple booster vaccinations are required. Puppies need 3 boosters one month apart, while kittens need 1 booster one month later, before becoming an annual routine.**
