Post-Surgery Essential:

Elizabeth Collar (This is prescribed after the surgery to prevent infection or opening the stitches caused by licking at the incision site. Other alternatives are not advised.)	\$13-18
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Additional Charges:

Pre-Anaesthetic Blood Work Strongly recommended to help detect any pre-existing conditions that may increase anaesthetic risk, especially for pets over 7 years old, pets undergoing general anaesthesia for the first time, or pets with existing medical concerns. Complete Blood Count (CBC) – \$65 Checks red blood cells, white blood cells, and platelets. It helps detect anaemia, infection, inflammation, platelet issues, and possible blood-related problems before anaesthesia. General Health Profile (GHP) – \$120 Checks key organ and metabolic values, including liver, kidney, blood sugar, protein levels, and electrolytes. It helps assess whether the major organs are healthy enough to process anaesthesia safely. Comprehensive Health Profile (CHP) - \$180 A more detailed blood profile that includes a wider assessment of organ function, metabolic health, electrolytes, proteins, and other important health indicators. It is useful for senior pets, pets with known health concerns, or cases in which a more comprehensive pre-anaesthetic screening is recommended. IDEXX SNAP 4Dx TEST (Strongly recommended for pets who have not been on tick and flea prevention as well as heartworm protection.)	\$65
COAGULATION PANEL(PT/APPT) (PT-This blood test checks how quickly your pet's blood can clot. It's important before surgery or if we suspect poisoning or bleeding problems, because if the blood doesn't clot properly, even small injuries or operations can become dangerous. APPT-It helps us see if the blood takes too long to clot, which can happen with certain illnesses, medications, or clotting disorders. This is important to know before surgery or if your pet is bleeding. These tests check how well your pet's blood can clot from two different pathways, helping us detect bleeding risks or clotting problems, especially before surgery.)	\$145
